

# What's For Thanksgiving? John 6:60-71

I've Made Some Observations About Religion in Our Society to Share With You

- It seems today that, in Christianity, some people believe that they are "doing Jesus a favor" by having faith
- It almost seems that people expect Jesus to come "begging them" to make a commitment to Him
- Some people believe that Jesus is so desperate for disciples, that He is happy with you, "no matter what!"
- Now I understand that Jesus loves everyone and desires all of us to be saved, 1 Timothy 2:4

- But some picture Jesus like a "street beggar" asking for change, and anything we give Him or any "halfhearted alterations" we make in our lives, makes Him "incredibly grateful!"
- Our Thought Process is like this: "If I
  come to church on occasion, Jesus
  should be happy/grateful for that!"
- "Well a little devotion is better than no devotion." "I'm doing Jesus a favor when I come to worship."
- It's like helping your Aunt Johnnie move out of her house
- "I'm such a good person because of what I've done"





## **But this Is Not the Picture Of Christianity in the Bible**

- Jesus doesn't like behavior that is half-hearted and not fully committed
- He calls that kind of commitment, "Lukewarm" which disgusts Him; Listen to Revelations 3:16

"So, because you are lukewarm—neither hot nor cold—I am about to spit you out of my mouth"

Jesus wants people to be serious about their Christianity!



Jesus In

"Very truly I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the son of man and drink His blood, you have no life in you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up at the last day. For my flesh is real food and my blood is real drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood remains in Me and I in them.

Just as the living Father sent me and I live because of the Father, so the one who feeds on me will live because of me. This is the bread that came down from heaven. Your ancestors ate manna and died, but whoever feeds on this bread shall live forever."

John 6:53-58





- Jesus now shares with them a necessary truth that didn't sit well with their traditional Jewish thinking
- The Jews understood Manna as bread that their ancestors ate to physically sustain them when they were in the wilderness as they traveled to the promised land
- This was physical food provided by God for His people, along with Quail Exodus 16:1-36
- But Jesus is telling them that they must eat/digest His teachings to live for God

### **Observations**

- Therefore using this metaphor,
  Jesus starts to tell them about
  eating and drinking His flesh and
  blood
- Now the Jews in the O.T. were commanded to refrain from eating human flesh or drinking blood, Leviticus 17:13-14
- So this teaching is shocking and disgusting to the Jews
- To the Jews blood represented death and pain

But Jesus is Talking to the Jews About a Total Surrender of Self!

The Jews Would Have to Die to Self to Live for Christ (We Have to Do the Same Thing)





So What's For Thanksgiving? You and Me Galatians 2:20

The Disciples Said: "This is a hard saying; who can understand it?"



- Looking at this question carefully from His disciples, it does not mean what Jesus said to them was hard to interpret.
- What it means to them is that Jesus' teachings would be hard to follow
- They immediately saw the ramifications of His ideas.
- They immediately saw that:
   "If I literally follow Jesus,
   it's going to cost me
   something" Matt. 16:24

- Some of His disciples were offended by this teaching
  - Some are offended by teaching simple New Testament Christianity today
  - Jesus says that vain worship was prominent in His day, and it is very prominent today; Matthew 15:7-9

"Ye hypocrites, well did Esaias prophesy of you, saying, This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips; but their heart is far from me.

But in vain do they worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men ..."

### Remember At This Point Jesus Was Very Popular

There are countless numbers of people following Him in John 6

And Jesus already knows that His words have offended some and were hard to handle

- And so Jesus, realizing the heart of His disciples, addresses that heart: Jesus was aware that His disciples were complaining, so He said to them, "Does this offend you? Then what if you see the Son of Man ascend where He was before!"
  - If Jesus' prophecy of His sacrifice disturbed their dreams of a temporal kingdom, how about His ascension from them? Acts 1:6

# But Look At What Happened John 6:66

From that time many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more.

- Some of the disciples left Jesus because the requirements to stay were too great. The people wanted to give a little, but Jesus expected a lot
- The people wanted a relationship with Christ, but on their terms
  - Some Christians will jump from Congregation to Congregation, looking for a church with lesser accountability (nobody keeps up)

"I'll take some Christianity-lite Please!"

## As I Close Let Me Hasten to Say This:

- Jesus doesn't beg people to stay with Him
- No one is forcing you today to commit to Christ
- As the desertion of Jesus continued in John 6, look at what Jesus says to His inner circle of twelve; Verse 67:

Do You Also Wish to leave? (My door swings both ways)

- Every man or woman has free will, and Jesus doesn't override that
- This is not a question of "angst," as if to say, "please stay."
- It's a question for the benefit of His disciples. (Consequences)

Will The Disciples Stay Or Will They Go? The Choice Is Theirs The Choice Is Yours The Conditions of Discipleship Can Be Heavy Sometimes 2 Tim. 3:12 **Some Have Already Left** Will You?
