CHOOSING CORRECTLY

ACTS 1:15-26

BACKDROP

- Recall Judas Iscariot hanged himself after selling the Lord out for 30 pieces of silver. **Matthew 27:3-9**
- So, one of the apostles' first orders of business was to choose Judas' replacement.
 - . . . Let another take his place. Acts 1:20
- An editorial comment -- Never think that you are indispensable (that people cannot get along without you)!
- In selecting Judas' replacement, the apostles provide an effective pattern to follow when making important, enduring decisions.
 - Remember, these would be the men to lead the charge in witnessing for the Lord and getting the Church off the ground.

THE PROCESS

1. Establish the Criteria (and stick to it)

- "Therefore, of these men who have accompanied us all **the time that the**Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of
 John to that day when He was taken up from us, one of these must
 become a witness with us of His resurrection." Acts 1:21-22
- Some decisions are too important to be made on the "buddy system" or "the good ol' boy network."

2. Review and Carefully Consider the Alternatives

- And they proposed two: Joseph called Barsabas, who was surnamed Justus, and Matthias. Acts 1:23
- Do not rush needlessly; be deliberate and sober.

3. Pray for God's Wisdom and Guidance

• And they prayed and said, "You O Lord, who knows the hearts, show us which of these two You have chosen to take part in this ministry and apostleship from which time Judas by transgression fell . . ."

Acts 1:24-25

4. Make the Decision Accordingly

- And they cast their lots, and the lot fell on Matthias. And he was numbered with the eleven apostles. Acts 1:26
- Have no regrets or buyer's remorse!

Be added to the Lord's body

Hear the gospel (Acts 15:7; Romans 10:17);

Believe the gospel (Acts 8:37,15:7);

Repent of sins (Acts 2:38);
