#### INTRODUCTION

In relationships, we find at least two ways the members get things done –

- 1.**Independently** An individual works by himself or herself without input or contribution of the other(s).
  - Note Moses' father in law's word of caution. **Exodus 18:17-23**

• Taking on more than you should alone is neither good for you nor the people you are serving.

- 2.**Dependently** One person consciously does not provide input and relies exclusively on the other(s) to get things done.
- But Paul instructs us to bear one another's burdens and fulfill the law of Christ, noting that each, however, should bear his own load. **Galatians 6:2, 5**

## Our text alludes to yet another way, which is by far the best, to get things done →

3. **Interdependently**: where members and participants come to rely on one another in a commune of responsibility sharing. Where individuals willingly accept their role and move for the good of the enterprise, team or relationship.
